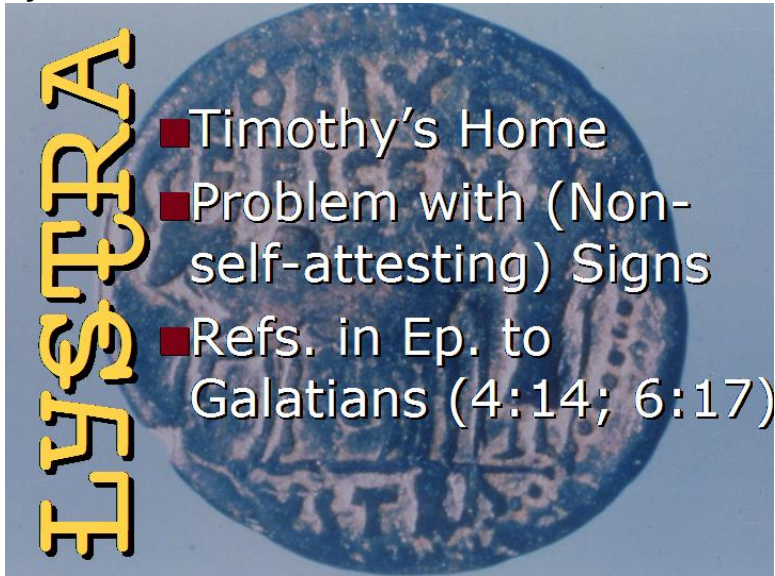
Iconium

- Note: Iconium the central site of the (fictitious) adventures of the 2nd cent. - *Acts of Paul and Thecla*

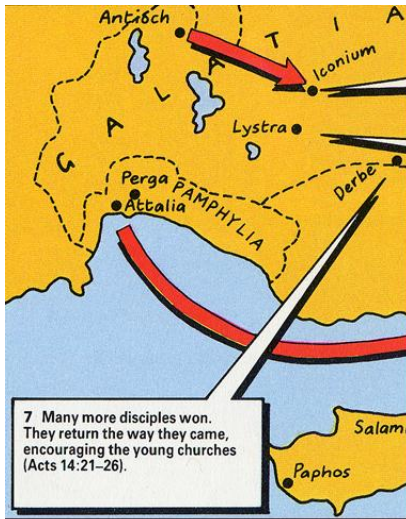
